Talks and Demonstrations

Commencing from 10am, talks and demonstrations will provide inspiration and information throughout the day.

The Hall stage will be the venue for speakers. Hear about the unique geology of the Dereel Swamp from Julie Lee, find out how to keep poultry from Kim Stanley, learn more about small animals and equines from the Golden Plains Vets, learn the finer points of essential oils from Clio Ellis-Perez and celebrate the creation of the Dereel Community Hub Incorporated with Mitchel Fielding.

The Community Centre will feature a range of craft demonstrations throughout the day including calligraphy, card making, hand quilting and the process of turning fleece into spun and dyed fibres. Your guides will be Jules Butterworth, Michelle DeGroot and Sallie Inwood.

Outside, the CFA will demonstrate how to extinguish a gas bottle fire, Bill Luke will help you to keep your pump in top condition and some local car enthusiasts will have their prized cars on display.

The CERT Shed will host the Hub Café for the day,

along with presentations of "Coffee from Tree to Cup" and a special CFA 'Fire Ready Victoria' workshop.

Along the way, we hope to bring you a few more presenters speaking about self-sufficiency.

Hub Café at Spring Festival

The *Hub Café* coffee will continue this weekend at the Spring Festival.

We have been operating from the Community Centre kitchen for the past few weeks and I just love introducing everyone to new tastes.

I have the latest pour over and a full commercial filter coffee maker plus a fabulous Breville home espresso machine. You can taste how different brewing methods affect the flavour of the coffee and the results are always surprising. An example of this is our Ethiopian Yirgacheffe coffee. It has heaps of chocolate and apples when made on the Breville but is full of lemons and citrus when the pour over technique is used and quite subdued when put through the filter.

If you would like to play with coffee at the Spring Festival, come to the Dereel CERT Shed. You can taste a few different coffees and I will be doing my best to answer your questions in explaining the process of coffee from plantation to cup.

A hint on how to get better coffee using one easy step: DO NOT POUR BOILING WATER ON ANY COFFEEeven instant coffee. Boiling water will burn the coffee and make the bitterness overwhelm any desirable tastes. The trick is to get the kettle to click off at boiling THEN prepare your ingredients, coffee, milk and sugar (if you must) before you introduce coffee and water. The best temperature for the water is 93 degrees C.
