## **Community Garden**

The Dereel Community Garden Group has made a great start on the vegetable garden with the help of the Men's Shed and working bee volunteers.

Along with the fruit trees, the wicking beds make a visual impact when you visit the Dereel Reserve. Four of the wicking beds are now planted with a range of seeds and seedlings, including lettuce, strawberries, green feast peas, dragon tongue beans, carrots, zucchini and more.

In total there are 15 wicking beds to construct and plant so by the end of the season there should be plenty of produce!
