Local Flora and Fauna

Black Shouldered Kite

This year has seen an increase in the number of Black Shouldered Kites in the Dereel/Corindhap/Rokewood areas.

Mostly seen in open grassland areas where they will hover, waiting for prey. Once prey is spotted the birds will plunge feet first with wings held high in a 'V'.



Carol says:

"The Black Shouldered Kites is one of this photographers favourite birds with their piercing red/orange eyes.

I never tire of the chance to get out and photograph them."



Several species of Sundew plants grow around Dereel, but the Scented Sundew plants are easily identified by their spoon-shaped leaves covered with red sticky hairs which trap small insects.

Flowers are pure white with five petals, and will flower in late Winter through into Spring.

You may find you have the insectivorous plant which is known as Scented Sundew (Drosera aberrans).
